An interdisciplinary team including neurology and neuropsychiatry services, providing consultations for CAMH patients and community members who have:

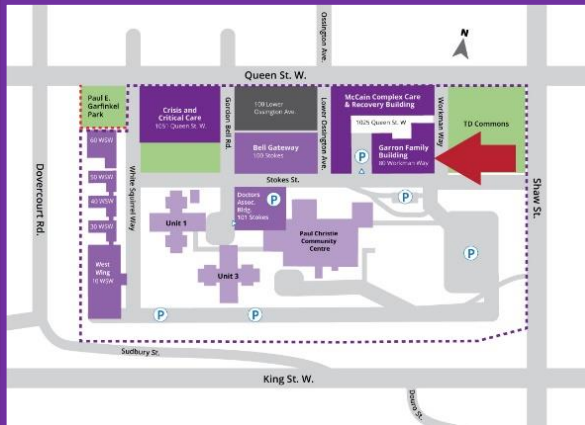
- Atypical neurodegenerative disorders

Services

We provide interdisciplinary neurology and neuropsychiatry clinical care including:

- Initial evaluations
- Second opinions
- Follow-up medical and psychosocial care after initial diagnosis
- Linkage to community resources
- Caregiver education, guidance and support



The CAMH Neuropsychiatry Clinic provides consultation and follow-up care for people \geq age 18 who have new or longstanding neuropsychiatric disorders.

Our team

Neurologists:

Specialize in assessing and managing neurological conditions, with specific focus on movement disorders and problems with thinking and memory.

Neuropsychiatry:

Assessment and management of psychiatric and cognitive problems for individuals with neurological challenges.

Nurse practitioner:

Performs intake assessments, oversees medication management, and provides standardized screening and general medical support.

Neuropsychology:

Specialize in standardized neuropsychological tests to identify memory and other cognitive impairment and suggest compensatory strategies.

Social workers:

Specialize in assessing and managing the psychosocial impact of memory loss, and ways to provide direct support and access to services in the community.

Occupational therapists:

Provide support for neurological conditions to improve functional independence and safety, provide education about compensatory strategies and community resources.

Registered nurses:

Provide physical and mental health assessments and medication support.
