PROBLEMATIC SEXUAL BEHAVIOURS

Where to go when you're looking for help

Updated: March 2024

Various services exist to help people manage or reduce sexual behaviours or urges that have become problematic. These behaviours or urges may affect their relationships; cause feelings of shame, guilt or loneliness; create worry about sexually transmitted infections; or result in financial and legal concerns.

Treatment depends on the type of behaviour and may involve a combination of individual, couple or group therapy. People seeking treatment may have problems with hypersexuality (commonly called sex addiction) or they may have a paraphilia (where sexual arousal involves fantasies, urges or behaviours that are extreme and less common).

Some people have been mandated by the courts to get treatment because they have been found guilty of sexual abuse or other illegal sexual conduct. Other people seek treatment because their sexual behaviour or urges have caused suffering to themselves and people around them.

Eligibility: Ages 18+; people with sexual behaviours or urges that have resulted, or could result, in legal involvement: may be neurodiverse or have mental health or substance use problems; may have been convicted of a sexual offence and require court-mandated treatment

Referral: Through probation or parole officer for people with convictions; through a physician when there is no legal involvement; referral forms available on website

Notes: Interpreters available for assessment and treatment; clinic does not offer pre-sentence assessment or treatment or assessments for family court purposes
